

RODRIGUES REGIONAL ASSEMBLY ACT

**Regulations made by the Rodrigues Regional Assembly under sections
26 and 31 of the Rodrigues Regional Assembly Act**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rodrigues Regional Assembly (Market) Regulations 2026.

2. In these regulations –

“authorised article” means an article as specified in regulation 4 (1);

“authorised officer” means an inspector in matters of health and food safety, a veterinary officer, a forest officer, a fisheries protection officer, a consumer protection officer, a police officer or any officer of the Commission designated in writing by the Departmental Head;

“child” means a person aged less than 16 years;

“Commission” means the Commission responsible for the subject of markets;

“contract” means a contract for the occupation of a stall in the form set out in the Second Schedule;

“Departmental Head” means the supervising officer or Departmental Head of the Commission;

“employee” means any person employed by the stall occupier to occupy his stall as the Commission may approve;

“food” –

(a) means any substance destined for human consumption; and

(b) includes –

(i) drinks and bottled water;

(ii) chewing gum and other products of similar nature and use; and

- (iii) substances used or intended for use as ingredients in the composition or preparation of food; but
- (c) does not include –
 - (i) live animals;
 - (ii) plants prior to harvesting;
 - (iii) fodder or feed;
 - (iv) cosmetics;
 - (v) drugs or medicine as defined in the Pharmacy Act;
 - (vi) tobacco and tobacco products;
 - (vii) narcotic or psychotropic substances, and dangerous drugs as defined in the Dangerous Drugs Act; and
 - (viii) veterinary drugs for use in livestock feed;

“frozen food” includes any poultry or poultry product, meat, meat product, whole or filleted fish, fish product and seafoods which have been maintained at a temperature of -18 degrees or below;

“identification badge” means a badge in the form set out in the First Schedule;

“market” means a space in or out of the precincts of a building or such other place designated by the Regional Assembly for the sale and purchase of authorised articles;

“meat” includes every edible part of an animal fit for human consumption;

“Sanitary Authority” has the same meaning as in the Public Health Act;

“stall” means any booth or other space in the market allotted by the Commission for the sale of authorised articles;

“stall occupier” means any person authorised by the Commission to occupy a stall or any other place for the sale of authorised articles inside the market;

“vegetables” includes tubercules and any herbs, creepers or leaves;

“venison” means any edible part of a deer, stag, hind including offals fit for human consumption;

“veterinary officer” has the same meaning as in the Animal Diseases Act.

3. (1) There shall be a market at –

- (a) Port Mathurin;
- (b) Mont Lubin;
- (c) La Ferme;
- (d) Grand La Fouche Corail; and
- (e) such other place as the Commission may designate.

(2) For every day of the week, a market shall open at 5.00 a.m. and shall close at 5.30 p.m., except on Sundays and public holidays where it shall close at 12.30 p.m.

(3) Notwithstanding paragraph (2), the Commission may, for specific purpose, authorise any section of a market to open or close at such time as it may determine.

(4) (a) Every stall occupier shall leave the market not later than an hour before the market closes.

(b) No stall occupier or any other person shall stay inside a market after the market is closed.

(5) No member of the public shall enter a market within half an hour of its closing time.

(6) No stall occupier shall, without the prior written authorisation of the Commission, erect or cause to be erected any structure on his stall.

(7) (a) No person shall scatter or throw, in the market, any leftover, leaves, peelings, waste paper or other refuse.

(b) Every –

- (i) stall occupier shall dispose of his waste or refuse;
- (ii) person shall dispose of leftover, leaves, peelings, waste paper or other refuse,

in such receptacle as the Commission may provide.

(8) Every butcher shall provide, at his own expense, a block for chopping purposes.

(9) For the purpose of storing meat, chicken, fish or seafood, every stall occupier shall provide for a chilling cabinet.

(10) Every butcher shall, on a daily basis, clean his stall, chopping block, the interior of his stall and such utensils as he may use.

4. (1) A stall occupier may, in the market, sell the following authorised items –

- (a) grown fruits, vegetables, edible roots, tubers, betel leaves, pickles or herbal, aromatic non-poisonous medicinal plants, pickles;
- (b) haberdashery, fancy goods, cutlery, earthenware, chinaware, glassware, toys, ready-made garments, cosmetics, articles of clothing, footwear;
- (c) small hardware, electric, electronic, metallic appliances, plastic products, utensils;
- (d) milk, infused tea, coffee and cocoa, soft drinks, milk products, lemonade, minerals, fruit juices, non-alcoholic beverages, bottled water by retail;
- (e) beef, fish, veal, mutton, lamb, goats and kid's flesh, hare, rabbit, meat, pork, sausages, black pudding or other preparations made from pork or tripe;
- (f) offals of goat, beef, chicken, sheep or pork;
- (g) fresh, chilled or frozen chicken or eggs;
- (h) venison;

- (i) fresh fish;
- (j) fresh, chilled or frozen seafoods;
- (k) salted and dried fish;
- (l) grain to be used as food;
- (m) bread, cakes, pastries, cooked foods, pre-packed foods and other foods items;
- (n) flowers, bouquets;
- (o) locally made handicrafts, baskets or any other wickerwork of local manufacture;
- (p) chilled or frozen meat, frozen vegetables or frozen fish;
- (q) locally produced honey and wax;
- (r) stationery, newspapers, books, magazines or greeting cards; or
- (s) such foodstuffs or non-foodstuffs, as the Commission may approve.

(2) No person shall expose for sale in the market such toxic or prohibited fish or seafood as may be prescribed.

(3) No person shall, except with the written authorisation of the Sanitary Authority, introduce into the market any locally grown mushrooms.

(4) No carcass of a sheep, lamb, goat or kid shall be exposed for sale without its tail and skin.

(5) The flesh of a goat or kid shall be exposed for sale separately from the flesh of mutton or lamb.

(6) No person shall expose for sale in a market any sausage, black pudding or preserved pork not been prepared in licensed premises.

(7) Every frozen or chilled fish shall, before being exposed for sale be gutted and cleaned.

(8) No meat shall be admitted into the market unless it has been certified by a veterinary officer to be fit for human consumption.

(9) No stall occupier shall sell or expose for sale vegetables, fruits, meat, fish, poultry, seafoods or any food items which are unfit for human consumption.

5. (1) Cooking of food shall be authorised only in such area as the Commission may determine for that purpose.

(2) No person shall introduce a dog or any other domestic animal into the market.

(3) No person shall sit on a table or stall in the market.

(4) No person who is not decently dressed or is under the influence of intoxicating drinks or drugs shall be authorised in a market.

(5) (a) Every stall occupier selling haberdashery products, or involved in the cooking of foods or other similar activities shall, at all times, keep in his custody a fire extinguisher which shall be in good working condition.

(b) Every stall occupier shall, before leaving the market, extinguish every cooker or any other apparatus used for cooking.

(6) No stall occupier shall keep, in the market, any barrel, basket, bag or other similar receptacle, except for the purpose of storing of grains, seeds or other articles requiring special receptacles for proper exposure.

(7) No person shall, in a market, cause any trouble or use foul, insulting or unbecoming language or behave indecently.

(8) No person suffering from any communicable disease shall trade in a market.

(9) No person shall enter into a market with his bicycle, autocycle, motorcycle or motor vehicle.

(10) No person shall smoke in a market.

6. (1) Any authorised article brought for sale into the market shall be openly exposed on the stall allotted to the stall occupier.

(2) The price of any article exposed for sale in the market shall be

conspicuously affixed.

(3) No hawking activity or sale by auction shall take place inside a market.

(4) No person shall cause any trouble or annoyance to any person in market premises.

(5) Every stall occupier shall, on demand, produce to an authorised officer, a certificate or such other document as may, to the satisfaction of the authorised officer, contain the name, address and telephone number of the –

(a) planter or the owner of the vegetables;

(b) manufacturer of locally-made handicraft; or

(c) beekeeper or apiculturist of honey,

sold by him.

(6) No meat shall be introduced or exposed for sale in the market unless it has been prepared in a licensed butcher shop and is accompanied by a permit signed by a veterinary officer on which shall be stated –

(a) the name of the owner of the animal from which the meat originates;

(b) the market at which the meat is intended to be sold;

(c) the number and weight of carcasses and the quantity of sausages, black-pudding and other preparations intended to be introduced in the market.

(7) No animal shall be slaughtered or dressed inside the market.

(8) Every stall occupier who sells fish or tripe shall, for the purpose of avoiding bad smell, keep a supply of fresh water constantly at hand, which he shall use to wash the articles sold by him.

(9) Every stall occupier gutting or cleaning fresh fish in the market shall have a watertight vessel placed close to his stall and containing a sufficient quantity of quick lime or any approved disinfectant, wherein to put the offal.

(10) No person shall gut fresh fish in any market unless he is the owner or occupier of the stall at which such sale is authorised.

(11) No offal shall be thrown on the ground in the market and its vicinity.

(12) No fresh fish remaining unsold at the close of the market shall be exposed for sale as fresh fish the following day.

(13) Frozen food to be sold in the market shall be kept in a freezer in accordance with the Food Act 2022.

(14) No frozen food shall be removed from a freezer except when required for sale.

(15) Where there is a power cut or breakdown causing the items stored in a freezer to thaw, the contents shall be disposed of in such manner as the authorised officer may direct.

(16) No meat, chicken, fish or seafood which have been removed from the market shall be reintroduced therein after their removal therefrom.

(17) No frozen or chilled meat, chicken, fish or seafoods shall be stored or exposed for sale together with fresh ones.

7. Every stall occupier shall clean the stall let to him.

8. Every vehicle bringing articles to the market shall be unloaded outside the gates or in such area as may be designated for that purpose and shall remain in the area until unloading is completed.

9. (1) Every stall occupier selling articles by weight or measure in the market shall have his own weights, measures and instruments, duly assized under the Legal Metrology Act.

(2) Every stall occupier selling by weight shall have a self-indicating weighing instrument.

(3) The weighing instrument shall be placed in such a position that the weighing of goods and the indicated weight are clearly visible to the purchaser.

(4) A set of appropriate weights, measures and instruments, duly assized under the Legal Metrology Act, shall be kept at the office of the officer in charge of the market.

(5) Any purchaser may request an officer on duty in the market to verify the quantity of his goods purchased, and should the said quantity not be found correct, the stall occupier who has sold the goods shall provide the difference.

10. (1) (a) Following an expression of interest, the Commission may, by contract, allocate any vacant stall for such period, and on such conditions, as it may determine.

(b) A contract under subparagraph (a) shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule.

(2) (a) (i) Every stall occupier shall whilst working on his stall wear conspicuously such identification badge issued to him by the Commission.

(ii) An identification badge issued under subparagraph (i) shall not be transferrable.

(b) Where a stall occupier ceases to occupy a stall or passes away, he or his surviving spouse or heir, as the case may be, shall forthwith surrender the identification badge to the Commission.

(c) Where the identification badge of a stall occupier is lost, defaced or damaged, the stall occupier shall forthwith inform the Commission accordingly.

(d) The Commission shall, on being satisfied that the identification badge of a stall occupier is lost, defaced or damaged, issue a duplicate on payment of the fee specified in the Third Schedule.

(3) (a) A stall occupier may employ not more than 2 persons to assist him and shall be responsible for any contravention committed by his employee.

(b) The stall occupier shall inform the Commission of the details of his employee and the Commission shall accordingly issue the employee an identification badge.

(c) (i) Any employee working on a stall shall wear conspicuously the identification badge issued to him by the Commission.

(ii) An identification badge issued under subparagraph (i) shall not be transferrable.

(d) Where an employee ceases to be employed by a stall occupier, or passes away, he or his surviving spouse or heir, as the case may be, shall forthwith surrender his identification badge to the Commission.

(e) Where the identification badge of an employee is lost, defaced or damaged, the stall occupier shall forthwith inform the Commission accordingly.

(f) The Commission shall, on being satisfied that the identification badge is lost, defaced or damaged, issue a duplicate on payment of the fee specified in the Third Schedule.

11. (1) No person shall, by hawking or otherwise, expose or offer for sale any goods or articles within a radius of 200 metres from a market.

(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to holders of a trade license operating inside commercial premises and auctioneers and or any licensee authorised by the Regional Assembly.

12. (1) No person shall write, paint, scribble or stick bills or posters on any wall, fixture or part of the market or cause any damage to any building, outhouse, or construction forming part of an annex to the market or to any object contained therein.

(2) No person shall feed birds and animals or allow food articles to be exposed in such manner that a bird or an animal gets access to them.

(3) No stall occupier shall store, display or sell in the market any explosive materials, fireworks, hazardous liquids, bulk gases or any substance which may be a source of danger to any person.

13. (1) The Departmental Head may take such measures as may be necessary to maintain order in the market and to ensure that these regulations are complied with.

(2) For the purpose of paragraph (1), an authorised officer may –

- (a) seize and detain or destroy any article not authorised in a market;
- (b) seize and destroy any article unfit for sale; or
- (c) give to a stall occupier such directions as he considers necessary.

(3) Every stall occupier shall comply with any direction given to him under paragraph (2)(c).

14. Every stall occupier shall, at all times, keep clean and tidy the stall occupied by him, including such places used for the storing of goods or food.

15. Every stall occupier shall produce a recent passport size photograph of the said employee for the purpose of registration.

16. No stall occupier shall cause a child to be registered as an employee.

17. (1) No person, in the market, shall —

- (a) spit;
- (b) beg;
- (c) play music in such a way so as to cause inconvenience to any other person;
- (d) store any goods or article behind a stall, unless, in the exercise of his trade as stall occupier or employee; or
- (e) wash any utensils inside and/or within the precincts of the market.

(2) No person shall leave behind any personal belongings or articles in the market.

18. No person shall —

- (a) sell any cooked food or bread except in clean covered receptacles adequately protected from flies, insects, dust, dirt or any other form of contamination;
- (b) use any newspapers, magazines for the wrapping of cooked food or bread;
- (c) handle any cooked food or cake except with proper utensils approved by the authorised officer.

19. (1) Where any stall occupier hinders, obstructs or molests, with or without force or violence, any authorised officer, the Commission may, pending

an enquiry and its determination, temporarily declare his stall vacant.

(2) (a) Every article exposed for sale in a stall under paragraph (1) shall be removed within such delay as the Commission may determine.

(b) The Commission may seize any article not removed within the delay specified in subparagraph (a).

20. No stall occupier shall sell or offer for sale any items other than those specified in the contract.

21. Every stall occupier shall carry out his activity in such manner as not to disturb neighbouring stall occupiers.

22. (1) Any person who contravenes these regulations shall commit an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding 10,000 rupees.

(2) (a) An authorised officer may seize any article that is the subject matter of a contravention under these regulations.

(b) Where the articles seized under paragraph (a) are perishable, they may be disposed of in such manner as the Commission may determine.

(c) Where the articles seized under paragraph (a) are not perishable, they shall be disposed of in such manner as the Court may determine.

23. These regulations shall be in addition to, and not in derogation of, any regulations made under an Act relating to the sale of food for human consumption.

24. These regulations shall come into operation on 1 January 2027.

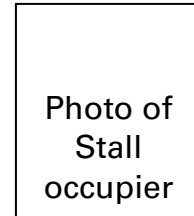

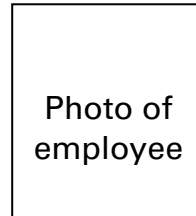

SECOND SCHEDULE

[Regulation 10(1)]

CONTRACT

Between

THE RODRIGUES REGIONAL ASSEMBLY, represented by the Departmental Head,
Commission responsible for Markets,
hereinafter referred to as the Regional Assembly,

PARTY ON THE ONE PART

And

..... holder of National
Identity Card number issued on
hereinafter referred to as the "stall occupier",

PARTY ON THE OTHER PART

IT HAS BEEN STATED, AGREED AND COVENANTED AS FOLLOWS –

1.0 RIGHT OF OCCUPATION

1.1. The Regional Assembly grants to the stall occupier the right of occupation (herein-after referred to as the "right of occupation") of stall no. (hereinafter referred to as the "stall") in the section in the market; situated at, Rodrigues Island, under the terms and conditions set out below.

1.2. The right of occupation is granted for the exclusive use of the stall only and at no time, shall the stall occupier occupy any other space in the market under this present contract. The stall occupier shall confine himself for the purpose of his trade to the space allotted to him by the Regional Assembly.

2.0. PURPOSE

2.1 The stall occupier shall occupy the stall for the sole purpose of selling and shall have no right to sell any other product in the stall.

3.0 DURATION AND RENEWAL

3.1. The right of occupation shall be for a period of year(s) from the to the

3.2. At its expiry, the right of occupation may be renewed, at the option of the Commission; such renewal may also be upon such revised terms, conditions, periods and/or fees, if any, as may be determined by the Commission.

3.3. In case there are any revised terms, conditions, periods and/or fees, the proposed revision(s), shall be notified in writing to the stall occupier, 60 days before the determination of the right of occupation. For this purpose, the letter containing the proposed revision(s) shall be posted at the address, herein-below set out, of the stall-occupier.

3.4. In the event that the stall occupier accepts to renew the right of occupation and accepts all the revised proposals, if any, the stall occupier shall, accordingly, enter into a new contract with the Regional Assembly at the expiry of the right of occupation.

3.5. In the event of non-acceptance and/or of refusal to sign the new contract, the right of occupation shall be terminated "ipso facto" and the stall occupier shall vacate the stall forthwith.

4.0 FEES AND NON-PAYMENT THEREOF

4.1. The right of occupation of the stall is granted in consideration of a yearly fee (the "right of occupation fee") which amounts to Rs and shall be paid in full at the date of signature of these presents and thereafter on the first day of each year.

4.2. Such payment shall be made at the Cashier's Office, Central Administration, Port Mathurin.

4.3. In the event the stall occupier fails to pay the right of Occupation Fee within three months from the date of payment, the Commission shall send a notice (the "Notice"), by registered letter, to the stall occupier requesting him to settle all arrears of right of Occupation Fee within a delay of 7 days from receipt of the Notice and notifying him that failure to do so may entail the termination of the right of occupation "ipso facto"; in case the stall occupier fails to comply with all the requirements of the Notice, the right of occupation may be rescinded "ipso facto"; such letter shall be sent by post or delivered at the address set out below and it shall be deemed to be sufficient service on the stall occupier.

4.4. Such rescission, if any, shall be without prejudice to any other action, which the Regional Assembly may lawfully be entitled to take against the stall occupier. The stall occupier shall forthwith vacate the stall and remove all articles there from. The stall occupier shall not be entitled to the payment of any indemnity or refund whatsoever.

4.5. The yearly fee is paid irrespective of the yearly trade fee which is to be paid by the stall occupier in respect of his trade in the stall.

5.0. SUBLETTING

5.1. The stall occupier shall not be entitled to sell, transfer, cede, let, assign or otherwise dispose the right of occupation. In case the stall occupier has done any such act or acts, the right of occupation shall come to an end *"de plein droit"* without any other formality or authority and the stall occupier shall be informed accordingly by letter sent by registered post at the address set out below.

5.2. Such rescission shall be without prejudice to any other action, which the Regional Assembly may lawfully be entitled to take against the stall occupier. The stall occupier shall forthwith cause the stall to be fully vacated and shall cause all articles to be removed there from. The stall occupier shall not be entitled to the payment of any indemnity or refund whatsoever.

6.0. EMPLOYEES

6.1. The stall occupier shall have the right to employ a maximum of two employees to assist him in his trade in the stall.

6.2. The stall occupier shall submit four passport size photographs of his employee/s and have the said employee/s registered.

7.0. STRUCTURAL CHANGES AND CHANGE IN SITE/ LOCATION

7.1. The Regional Assembly reserves itself the right to carry out any structural change on the stall or to alter the general layout of the market without the stall occupier being entitled to any compensation whatsoever for loss of trade, or otherwise. Such right shall include any alterations; repairs should the Rodrigues Regional Assembly consider it advisable.

7.2. For the purpose of carrying out works for structural change or upon the alteration of the general layout of the market, the Regional Assembly may, if it deems necessary, cause a change, whether provisional or permanent, in the site/location of any stall within the market/fair.

7.3. The stall occupier shall have no right, without the authorisation in writing of the Commission, to cause any change of any nature whatsoever of the stall and/or of the general layout of the market fair.

7.4. The stall occupier shall have no right, without the authorisation in writing of the Commission, to interchange his/her stall with any other stall occupier.

7.5. In the event the stall occupier has been authorised, in writing, to cause changes in the stall, the stall occupier shall have no right to claim any indemnity, compensation or the refund of any costs for such works; any enhanced value given to the stall shall accrue to the Rodrigues Regional Assembly.

7.6. In case the stall occupier vacates the stall for any reason whatsoever or in case of death of the stall occupier, no party (including the stall occupier, his/her employees, his/her heirs and assigns) shall be entitled to the payment of any damages, indemnity or compensation for any enhancement or improvement to the stall.

8.0 ELECTRICITY AND OTHER CHARGES

8.1. In case the stall occupier requires electricity, water or other service for the purpose of his trade, he shall apply to the Commission in writing for authorisation to procure the service and the Commission may grant the authorisation subject to such direction as it thinks fit. The stall occupier shall bear the cost of installation and usage of any service. Pending the installation of individual meters by the Central Electricity Board, the stall occupier agrees to contribute, to refund or to pay back to the Commission such sum of money for his share of electricity used in his trade and consumed by him. The stall occupier shall settle same regularly within 10 days as from the date the claim has been sent to him. The Commission shall not be responsible for any damage, prejudice or inconvenience suffered by the stall occupier by reason of cancellation or disconnection of the electricity supply.

8.2. In the event the stall occupier fails to refund the Commission for a minimum of 2 months any charges of electricity paid by Commission on his behalf, the Commission shall send a notice (the "Notice"), by registered letter, to the stall occupier requesting him to settle all arrears thereof within a delay of 7 days from receipt of the Notice and notifying him that failure to do so may entail the termination of the right of occupation "ipso facto"; in case the stall occupier fails to comply with all the requirements of the Notice, the right of occupation may be rescinded. Such letter shall be sent by post or delivered at the address set out below and it shall be deemed to be sufficient service on the stall occupier.

9.0 RELOCATION AND CLOSURE

9.1. In the event that the Commission has, for any reasons whatsoever that it may deem fit, to relocate the market to another location, the Commission shall notify the stall occupier and shall, as far as practicable, give to the stall occupier an alternative stall in the new relocated site.

9.2. In the event that the Commission has, for any reasons whatsoever that it may deem necessary, to close the market or any part thereof, the Commission shall notify the stall occupier and may, as far as practicable, give to the stall occupier an alternative stall at another site.

9.3 In case no alternative stall is available, as set out in clauses 9.1 and 9.2 above, the stall occupier shall vacate the stall at such date as the Commission may direct. Such vacation shall be without compensation.

10.0 DEATH OF STALL OCCUPIER

10.1 The stall occupier's death shall put an end to the contract binding him to the Regional Assembly and the Regional Assembly shall have the right to take back the possession of the stall immediately.

10.2 In case the stall occupier passes away, any of his heirs must immediately inform the Commission of the demise of the stall occupier and produce his death certificate.

10.3 On humanitarian grounds, the Regional Assembly may, subject to the conditions set out in clause 10.6, agree that any of ascendant, descendant or surviving spouse, continue the right of occupation of the stall until the expiry of the trade fee for the period following the death provided that the stall occupier appoints a successor under clause 10.4 below. In case no appointment is made, the right to continue to occupy the stall until the expiry of the Trade Fee for the current year shall not be applicable.

10.4 The stall occupier hereby appoints as his successor being his ascendant/descendant/surviving spouse to continue to occupy, in case of death, the stall until the expiry of the trade fee for the trade fee period following the death.

10.5 At the expiry of the trade fee for the period following the death, the right of occupation shall lapse "ipso facto" and the successor shall have to vacate the stall.

10.6 The conditions under clause 10.3 are that the heir –

- (a) submits a request for the transfer of the stall;
- (b) has reached his eighteenth birthday at the time of submission of the transfer request;
- (c) submits a written consent of all the heirs, if any, entitled to the estate and succession of the late stall occupier together with a copy of the respective identity cards of each of the heirs;
- (d) produces a copy of his identity card and a copy of the affidavit of succession of the late stall occupier.
- (e) is not already the holder of any stall, shop or other place inside a market or fair;

11.0 COMPLIANCE

11.1 All the provisions contained in the Rodrigues Regional Assembly (Market) Regulations 2026 shall apply to all markets and the stall occupier and his employees, successors and/or heirs shall comply therewith.

11.2 Should the stall occupier be found guilty by a Court of non-compliance with laws relating to trade in the market or fair, the Regional Assembly may rescind the contract by notice in writing and without any judicial or extra judicial process. In that case, the stall occupier shall forthwith vacate the stall and remove all his articles therefrom and shall not be entitled to any compensation from the Regional Assembly.

11.3 In case the stall occupier and/or his successor and/or his heir provide false or incorrect information, the Commission may rescind the right of occupation “ipso facto”.

11.4 Should the stall occupier fail to comply with any one of the abovementioned Clauses, the Commission shall send a notice (the “Notice”), by registered letter, to the stall occupier requesting him to comply with the clause within a delay of 7 days from receipt of the Notice and notifying him that failure to do so may entail the termination of the right of occupation “ipso facto”; in case the stall occupier fails to comply with all the requirements of the notice, the right of occupation may be rescinded “ipso facto”. Such letter shall be sent by post or delivered at the address set out at clause 12.0 and it shall be deemed to be sufficient service on the stall occupier.

12.0 SERVICE
